ANTI- BULLYING WEEK 2023

Monday 13th - Friday 17th November

Anti-Bullying week begins with Odd Socks Day on Monday.

Children will be doing lots of activities around anti-bullying in their classes in assemblies this week. We will be sharing what we have been up to in a speasembly on Friday – we would love it if you could join us! Keep an eye out



This half term, the curriculum global theme is: Peace and Conflict. Everybody's learning is linked to this, as well as our assemblies, where we will be talking about bullying, being good friends, healthy relationships and consent.

In EYFS, children are learning about peace and conflict through celebrations, like Remembrance and Diwali.

In Key Stage One, the children are learning all about the Gunpowder Plot. Their big question is: Who was Guy Fawkes, what was the gunpowder plot and why do we remember it today?

Lower Key Stage Two are looking at conflict between the Romans and Anglo Saxons and invasions of Britain. Their big question is: How did Britain change between the end of the Iron age and the end of the Roman occupation?

In Upper Key Stage Two, the children are learning all about World War 2 and their big question is: How did Hitler's rise to power change life for Jewish people?
