Dear families,



> Children should be wearing full school uniform every day: a green sweatshirt or cardigan, white polo t-shirt or shirt and smart black/ grey trousers, pinafore dress or a skirt. **Leggings are not permitted.** Children should wear black school shoes or completely black trainers.

> If children do not arrive in the correct uniform, calls will be made to their adult at home and we will ask the children to change into our spare supply.

Derby and Derbyshire Integrated Care Board

We want to say a **huge thank you** to all of the families who gave consent for us to share information with your Royal Primary Care GPs last academic year, as part of the pilot study. This work has resulted in a roll out to all surgeries in Derbyshire, meaning that our children can get the best joined-up care.

From 1st September 2025, schools will be able to communicate directly with GP practices using an agreed process and communication form. This process assists schools to be proactive in sharing information as early as possible, as soon as issues arise. In most cases, the information provided by schools to General Practice will be for information only to ensure the practice is aware and alert to the child's needs.

We will always ask for your consent to share any information: it remains our priority to ensure the very best support for our children and we thank you for your support in this.

PERATION Operation Encompass is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and all police forces.

If you are concerned about the welfare of a

child you should speak to a DSL. If the risk is

Children who live in homes where there is domestic abuse, or who experience domestic abuse in their own teenage relationships, can be negatively impacted by this experience.

We have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained about Operation Encompass procedures. This allows us to use the information that has been confidentially shared with us by the police, to understand how a child may be impacted by domestic abuse and to then offer support to the child/ren in our care.

This information means that we can understand a child's behaviour and support that child in whatever way they may need or want.
