



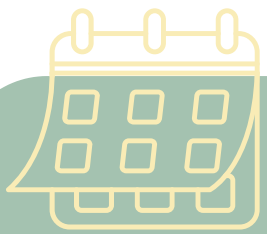

about wraparound

This year, we received a grant to set up wraparound provision for our children to support our families. Whilst this has been a huge benefit for some of our families and used well by those, there has not been enough uptake for us to continue with this provision from September. We are currently operating at a loss, and as funding ceases next year, there is no way that we can afford to run the provision with the income that we make.

This has been an incredibly difficult decision to make, as we know that the provision helps some of our families and is something additional that the school can offer but I hope that families are able to understand our rationale.

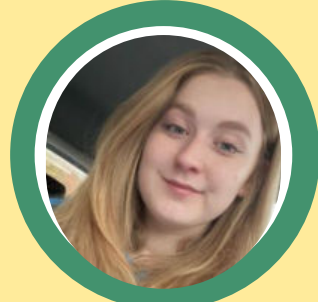

COLOUR RUN

Thursday 11th June 2026

In order to take part, children **MUST** wear the following:



sunglasses or goggles



a plain white T-shirt



plain black shorts or leggings



trainers or plimsolls

Children will NOT be allowed to take part without these items.

Our Colour Run is one of our most eagerly anticipated events and we know that it will be even bigger and better this year! We have listened to feedback and know that families would love to get involved in the action. We have decided to trial this, this year and invite our families to take part in the event. This will work differently for families of children in different year groups.

For children in EYFS and KS1: families will be invited to do the colour run alongside their children. Younger siblings may also join in but must be wearing the required clothing and protection.

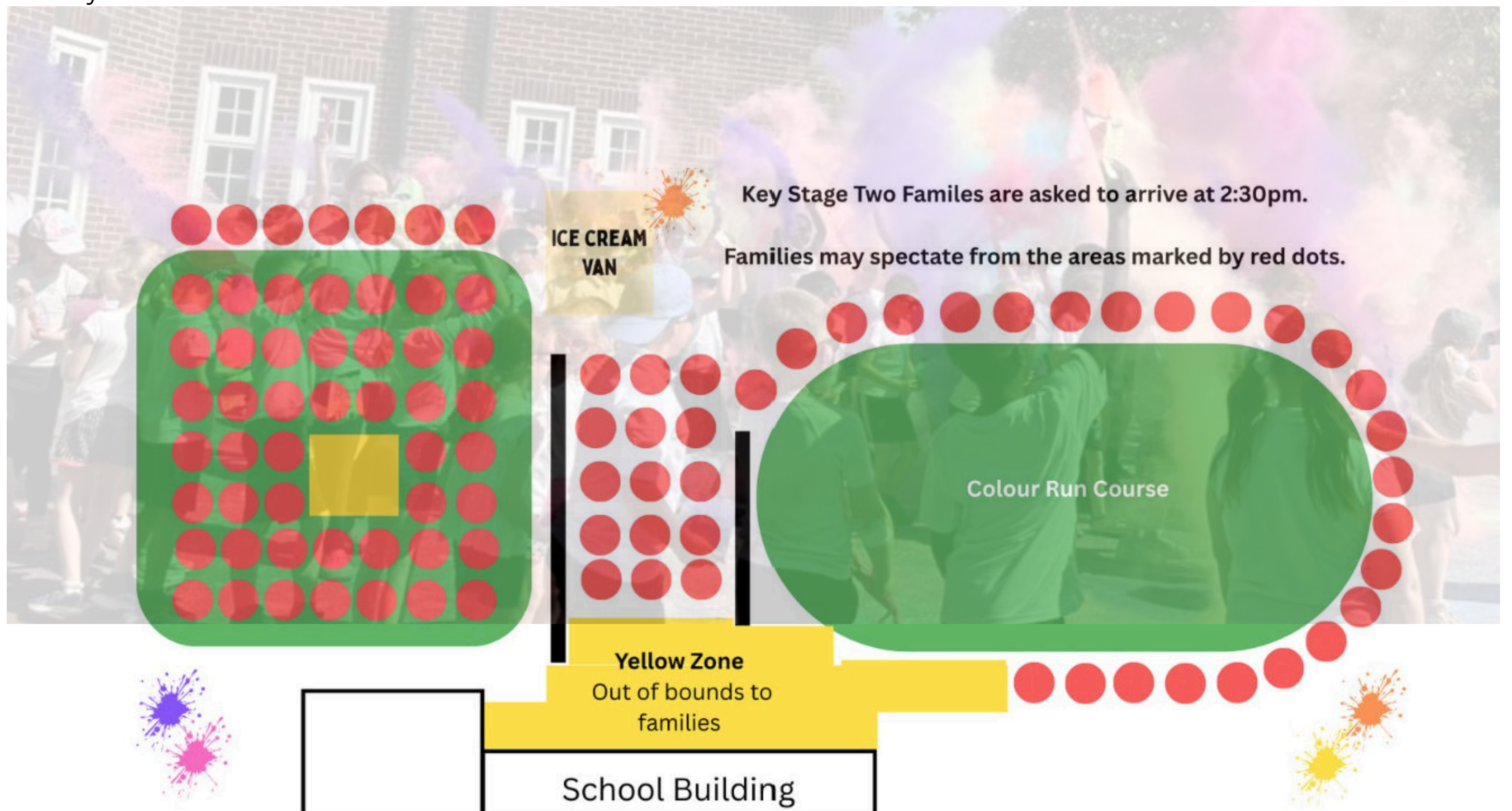
For children in Key Stage Two, families will be invited to take part **after** the children have finished.

If families wish to get in on the action, they can sign up on Parent Pay (a message will be sent out when this is live). Anyone taking part is required to wear a plain white T-shirt, plain black shorts or leggings and suitable footwear. Eye protection must also be worn by anyone taking part.

Paint and sunglasses will be on sale in the morning and money must be sent in a named envelope. Paint is £1 a pouch (limited to two per person) and sunglasses cost £2. There will be no sales of these items in the afternoon.

Adults taking part with KS1 will need to come to the KS1 doors at 1:45pm. Key Stage Two spectators should arrive at 2:30pm. Adults taking part in the adult-only event (after the children) will be called forward after all the KS2 children have completed the course.

Families are welcome to come and spectate, as in previous years, however, we need to ensure that this is safe and people are able to see their children, so please follow the instructions below. This worked really well last year so we have decided to stick to the same system.
